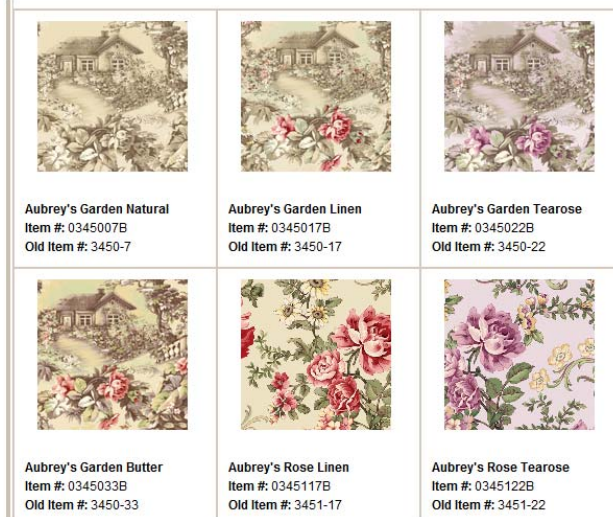


How to: Download fabric from the internet

Quilt-Pro Version 6

Ever purchased fabric from a website, then wished you could use it to design your quilt while waiting for the fabric to arrive? Well, in Quilt-Pro 6, it is super easy! Here's how.

Visit your favorite online quilt store and locate the fabric you wish to use. The fabric image should be of a single fabric.



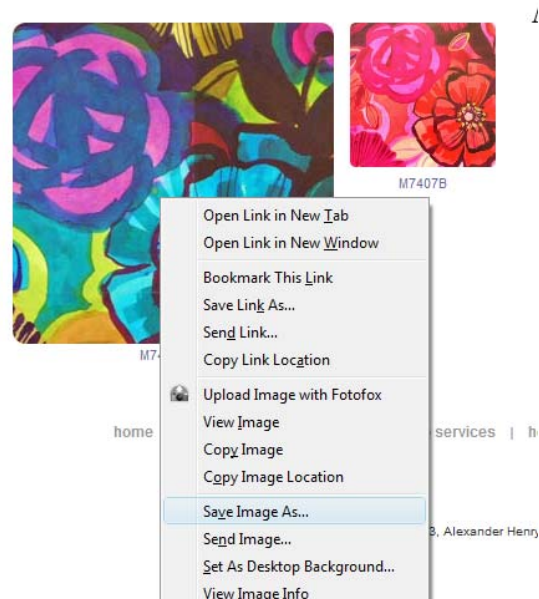
In the above image, each fabric is a single image. You can download this type of fabric image.

Any that have multiple fabrics in one image will not be suitable.



This image won't work because it is only one image file.

Place your cursor over the fabric image, and click your right mouse button. From the menu select "Save Image As..." or "Save Picture As..."



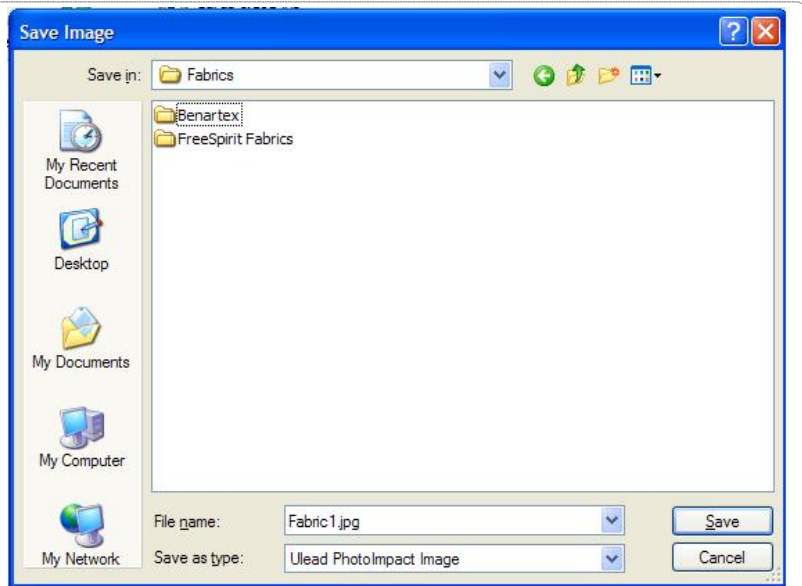
How to: Download fabric from the internet part 2

Quilt-Pro Version 6

Navigate to the Documents folder, locate and open the Quilt-Pro folder and open the Fabrics folder.

Add a descriptive filename. Note that most of the images found on the internet will have JPG or Gif extensions. Do not change the file type.

Click Save.

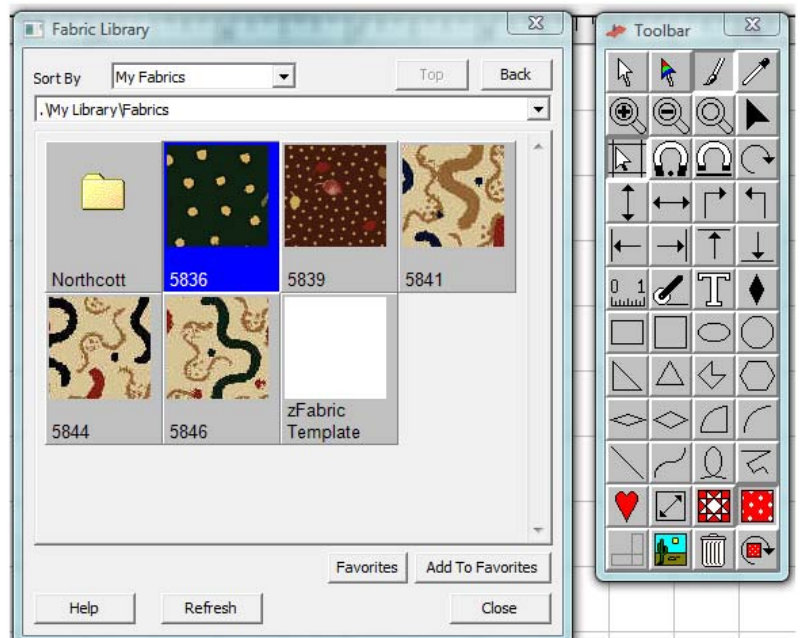


Once you have saved all the fabric images you like, how do you find the fabrics in Quilt-Pro 6?

Open the program to your favorite area and press the fabric library button on the toolbar.

When the library window opens, sort the library from Color to My Fabrics.

Select the fabric and paint.
